### Thematic track 6: Field Visit in Mabatini Informal Settlement, Nairobi

## GLTN Secretariat focal point: John Gitau

### A. Project Background

Pamoja Trust, through the support of Global Land Tool Network (GLTN) as facilitated by the UN-Habitat, is currently implementing the project on "Promoting Improvement of Tenure Security in Select Urban Informal Settlements through the Pilot Registration of Community Land Rights." Collectively, the project targets four select informal settlements in Nairobi and Mombasa counties. Amongst these target settlements is Mabatini – Pipeline informal settlement that is situated in Nairobi County, Mathare sub-county. The project seeks to strengthen the capacity of Mabatini community to register their land in accordance with most, if not all, the provisions of the Community Land Act (CLA) 2016, the attendant rules, and regulations for the implementation of the CLA Regulations 2018 and the Land Registration Act 2012.

#### B. Background of Mabatini settlement

Mabatini settlement is one of the 14 villages making up the Mathare Valley informal settlement in Nairobi. The settlement began in 1970s with the locals being allocated portions of land by the area chief at that time for construction of structures. Since then the population of Mabatini has been growing. The settlement sits on a public land whose ownership is heavily contested resulting to constant fears of possible forcible evictions. The latest contestation has been a court battle between an individual and the community where - in the most recent judgement on 9th August, 2021 - the city government was directed to cancel the allocation to any individual of the land on which Mathare Mabatini village stands and further allocate it to the residents of Mathare Mabatini Village on a communal basis. This was a huge win for the Mabatini community and had provided an opportunity to pursue collective ownership of the land under the Community Land Act 2016.

#### C. Pamoja Trust and GLTN's Collaborative Support to Mabatini Community.

Against this backdrop, Pamoja Trust has been supporting the community through the support from GLTN by:

- 1. Strengthening the capacity of the communities through sensitization on the provisions of the CLA including the registration of community land rights through, but not limited to, the registration of the communities towards producing an inclusive community register, establishment of community land management committees, development of sketch maps among others.
- 2. Supporting the community to employ the use of STDM to capture the requisite socio-demographic and economic information of community members in the settlements.

#### Field visit to Mabatini settlement

GLTN alongside its partners plan to take part in a field visit in Mabatini village on Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> May 2023. The main objective of the visit is for the partners to interact with the community of Mabatini and understand the dynamics of implementing the project on registration of community land rights in the settlement. The field visit shall constitute:

- 1. A walk around the settlement to understand the settlement's dynamics.
- 2. Information sharing session with the Community Land Management Committee to deepen knowledge on the land issues in the settlement and efforts made in pursuit for tenure regularization and the accompanying challenges in the pursuit of community land registration.
- 3. A detailed description on steps being undertaken towards supporting community land registration.
- 4. An interaction with the community's STDM data and how it is interpreted as the community land register.
